The Humanist Forum Presents - McCollum v. Board of Education, a documentary: Thursday, May 17, 6:30 pm
River Park Library, 2022 Mishawaka Ave, SB

This case, which went to the Supreme Court in late 1947 and was decided in 1948, decided the issue of whether public schools could support religious education by setting aside class time for religious instruction. In a landmark First Amendment decision, the Court ruled 8-1 that the public schools in this case were entangled with religious instruction — using public facilities and public funds — which was unconstitutional.
