# **Sunday Services**

#### June 3: Inertia-- Confessions of a Spoiled Southern Girl, led by Becky Roush

How do we decide where to put our energy? Work in the yard? Clean the house? Save the world? An exploration of why we do and, more importantly, don't do the things we "want" to do. How does inertia affect our choices, our lives and our community?

#### June 10: Journeys, led by Melanie Smith-Guillaume

When we think of journeys we've taken, we may recall itineraries or a mental slide show of places we've visited. Instead, I would like to consider these questions. What can journeys — inward and outward — teach us? And how can we use them to deepen our spiritual life?

#### Share the Plate Collection: Unity Gardens

In the summer of 2008, Unity Gardens was started by Sara Stewart with just one garden with the idea of feeding hungry people, and providing a place for diverse people to gather. Since then Unity Gardens has grown to include over 55 gardens of all shapes and sizes. They offer free food to the community, gardening, cooking and preserving classes to show how to cook healthy, and save your harvest. The organization has captured widespread support as an effective grass roots strategy to improve life for the entire community.

#### June 17: Fathers -- A Celebration, led by Rev. Byrd Tetzlaff

We will be celebrating some of the Good Men in our lives who have taken on the mentoring role.

#### June 24: How to Use the Neuroscience of Anxiety, led by Catherine Pittman

Clinical psychologist Catherine Pittman will explain what we know about anxiety in the brain, and how this knowledge can be useful in a practical way. Two pathways in the brain can initiate anxiety, and we need to understand both pathways to manage our anxiety effectively.

#### **Other Church News**

#### **Annual Meeting Summary**

During the Annual Meeting, the Strategic Plan was approved as a "roadmap and vision" for the congregation for the next five years. Members also charged the Board to implement the plan and report periodically to the congregation about progress.

The Officers elected were: Ron Robinson, Vice-President and Melanie Smith-Guillaume, Secretary; both two-year terms. *Trustees* elected were: Anne Mannix, two years; Rich Wallace, two years; and Janet Bogar, one year. Others elected were: *Endowment Committee* - Allen deSomer, three years; *Nominating Committee* - Susan Siemers, one year; Lois Holm, finishing a two-year term; Wendy Lohman, two years; and Mary Alice Lundergan, Alternate.

The Congregation approved an Annual Operating Budget for the next fiscal year, beginning on July 1, 2018, with a slight increase in projected income (\$178,100) and a slight decrease in projected expenses (\$189,771) from the current fiscal year. There is still a projected annual deficit, but a portion of that deficit will be covered by a transfer from the Endowment fund of \$5,000 to apply to the principal portion of the Church's mortgage payment during the year. The Church has adequate reserves to cover the remaining deficit.

The Stewardship Committee reported raising additional contributions in excess of \$75,000 for a one-time reduction in the principal balance of the mortgage, resulting in an annual decrease of about \$10,000 per year in mortgage payments for the remaining 9 1/2 years of the mortgage (until January, 2028).

Lastly, five disbursements from the Endowment Fund were approved as proposed, including: Mortgage Principal Pay-down; Sanctuary Technology Upgrade; Defibrillator (with training); Grounds Committee; and Mobile Ecology Center. **Pledge Statements**: The end of our fiscal year (June 30) is rapidly approaching. Our bookkeeper will email Pledge Statements listing contributions through May 31. If you have a balance, please try to fulfill your pledge by the end of the year. Thanks!

**Summer Building Use:** During the summer, committees often take a break. If you are doing so, please let the Office know so we don't cool a room which no one uses.
