Sunday Services

July 1: And Still We Rise by, Alan Hamlet and Florence Klecka. They will explore American resiliency in the face of setbacks.

July 8: What is oUUr Problem and What is oUUr Solution? By Rev. Colleen Squires. Religion scholar Stephen Prothero believes that different religions are responding to different problems. He writes - Christians identify the problem as sin, and the solution is salvation; for Buddhists, however, the problem is suffering and the solution is nirvana. What is our UU problem and what is our UU solution.

July 15: Left Behind, by Chuck Leone. The *Left Behind* series of apocalyptic books and movies tells the stories of End Times during which true believers are raptured into heaven and the rest of us remain on a chaotic earth to fight to survive, while God rains down judgment on the world for seven years. We may not expect to be raptured, but neither do we want to feel left behind as our culture and our world undergo the transformations of modern times. How do we proceed, as individuals, as a community and as a nation?

July 22: Understanding Each Other, by Dan Holm. He describes ways of communication that bring us together.

July 29: "Leave a Light On", by Rev. Misty-Dawn Shelly. Inspired by Howard Thurman's *The Dessert Dweller*. Rev. Shelly will explore some ways to bring the good news of our Unitarian Universalist faith to the roadside for those in need of safe harbor, spirit, and salvation.
