Minister's Notes

Dear Friends,

I am grieving. My mother's cancer has returned, and she has entered Hospice. We hope she will live through the holidays, but we cannot be sure. However long she yet survives, she has already lost a lot of what she enjoyed in life. I feel that I have already lost much of what made her my mother. So, I am grieving. One thing we know about grief is that, among other things, it is distracting. While we are grieving, we may find it harder to concentrate, and/or harder to remember things. I know that I am not operating at peak efficiency. I have not been, and I will not be, for perhaps several months yet. I say this, not as an excuse, but as a request for your understanding.

I will be fine. I still hope and intend to be here for you, whenever you need me. I will just be a little more imperfect than I usually am.

I will probably end up traveling back and forth to Ohio several times, throughout the next few months. I intend to communicate very clearly when I am planning to be where—and I will communicate where I am when I have to travel even though I had not planned it.

It is my hope that by being as transparent as possible about my own grief process, that it will help us all to manage when we or our loved ones experience grief and its complications.

Board News

Board Meeting Highlights

Special Meeting 10/25/18: The Board reviewed the Evaluation of the Minister done by the Committee on Ministry.

Regular Meeting 11/14/18

The Board has asked committees to study the Strategic Plan and bring a report to the Board outlining how their committee's work supports the issues brought out in the Plan. Committees will be scheduled throughout the year.

Suzanne Waller gave clear and wellthought-out examples of how Endowment Committee is contributing to the following Strategic Plan goals: 1) contributing to the financial health of the church, 2) growing membership development, 3) targeting 10% membership growth, 4) welcoming the greater community into the church, and 5) improving communication.

A portion of the meeting was dedicated to working on personnel issues.

President Chuck Leone suggested that we ask the Finance Committee to look at the new method of assessing our yearly payment to the UUA. We need to know what the fiscal impact of this new system will be. The Board concurred and treasurer, Elena Wake will take this to the Finance Committee.

There are still vacancies in staff and committees. We are looking for a replacement for our Office manager. Kathy Vetter is filling in as interim. We are also looking for an RE Director.

We need a Marketing Committee Chair, an RE Chair, and RE Committee members.

If you are interested in any of the above positions, please talk to Rev. Chip, Chuck Leone or any Board member.

The Board is asking Dale Gibson to draft a letter to the Jewish Synagogue in Pittsburgh.

The Board thanked David Mayfield for his work proposing an audio/visual system for the sanctuary. It would consist of two large televisions which would be installed in the front sides of the sanctuary ceiling and which could be raised and lowered automatically from spaces in the attic. There would also be a camera installed to record services. The cost would be covered by the Endowment Fund grant given to the committee at the Annual Meeting and funds not to exceed \$1,000 from leftover funds in the Website upgrade Account.

There was planning for details of the visit by the UUA consultant about the RE Program.
