Board News

March Board Meeting Highlights

- The Treasurer's Report reflected higher expenses for last month because of the flood in the sanctuary. Much of that expense will be reimbursed, however. We were also over budget for snow removal last month.
- President Chuck Leone has requested two grants from the Endowment Fund one for \$5,000 to help with upcoming roof repairs and one for \$5,000 for help with the principal of the mortgage next year.
- We are still looking for a Marketing Committee Chair and more Committee members.
- Screening of applications for Office Manager and for Coordinator of Religious Education (CRE) will be starting. Rev. Chip and Chuck Leone will be scheduling and doing interviews for the Office Manager. The RE Task Force and Rev. Chip will be screening applicants for the CRE.
- VP Ron Robinson will be calling together on Ad Hoc Outside Lighting Task Force to ensure safety and security around the building.
- Discussion was started about the new sanctuary technology, particularly how to deal with the videos that we are producing each Sunday. They need to be edited and put on the website. We will continue the discussion next month.
- The Board decided that it needs a policy concerning sponsorships of other groups and activities.
