Lawn Mowers Needed

The grass is growing again. So, we again need volunteers to mow our lawns. You

Our long-range plans for improving our grounds were given a big boost by the efforts of volunteers who showed up for the May cleanup and Garry Roberson, who has been maintaining our rain gardens. With more sun, we should be seeing beautiful flowers soon. An organic lawn care company has aerated the soil, planted grass, and applied compost tea to improve the quality of our lawn. Boulders and plants will be added to the Memorial Garden area on the south side of the building. Efforts to improve the drainage in the northeast section of our grounds and prepare it as an RE play space will occur soon with better weather by adding enough sand to counterbalance the heavy clay soil.

Around the UU

UU Membership

Here's an update on UU membership, from our UUA: "Adult membership is steady overall, coming in at 154,704, almost identical to last year. We have stabilized a downward trend in membership that had run 2010-2017, but beneath the headline we see substantial movement in membership figures in congregations.

Last year 43% of congregations grew their adult membership, and 30% grew their RE enrollment. Growth is coming largely from our smallest congregations – of the almost 400 members we added to brick and mortar UUA congregations last year, 70% were from congregations of under 150 members. Regionally there is also some variation. The Central East, New England and Southern Regions grew this past year, and the Southern Region in particular has been a source of growth over the past five years." For the full article:

Board News

Board Highlights

The Raise the Roof Campaign is now underway! At the Congregational meeting on May 19, 2019, the Church membership authorized replacement of the Church's north roof at an estimated cost of \$36,600.00. Sources of committed and available funding have been identified to help meet that goal:



- \$4,000 Endowment Funds (as recommended, subject to congregational approval)
- **\$2,639 Roof Funds** (specifically designated for the roof, some during *Ginger Bear* fundraiser)
- \$3,049 Capital Campaign Funds (originally for building purchase & renovation)

In addition, the Congregation has authorized the Church to borrow additional funds up to \$20,000.00 when our mortgage note is renewed in July of this year, but we hope not to use that authority if possible.

The Stewardship Committee has begun the process of asking members for a commitment to the project, and we have contributions and commitments totaling \$12,200.00 as of this writing. Please consider your resources and contact a member of the Raise the Roof campaign (Stewardship Committee Chair Ron Robinson, members Janet Bogar, Barb Boyd, Gary Metzler, Joseph Gress, Chuck Leone or Roger Birdsell) with your pledge.
