Minister's Notes

22 July 2019

Well, I am no longer in "Final Fellowship" with our Unitarian Universalist Association. Don't be alarmed—nobody is. We changed it from "Final Fellowship" to "Full Fellowship" at General Assembly, several weeks ago.



"Final" seemed to imply that we were finished, that we would not learn more or evolve further in our ministries. This is clearly untrue. We all can grow and adapt, and I see it occurring in most of my colleagues. That said, there are always a few who seem to be overly comfortable, or even resistant to further growth. In particular, we want to encourage all ministers to keep up-to-date on such things as best practices in identifying and combatting white supremacy culture, and in increasing our accountability so that less harm comes to our congregants and to our ministerial colleagues.

"Preliminary Fellowship" is still the initial step, after seminary. It means we've satisfied all the requirements, and are ready to begin a career in professional ministry. During Preliminary Fellowship, we are evaluated on an annual basis, to make sure that we are living into ministry successfully. After three satisfactory evaluations, we move from Preliminary to Full Fellowship.

The Board voted to engage Dudek Roofing, who had already given us a quote, to repair and reroof the north roof. The Raise the Roof Campaign secured pledges of \$28,050, and with the Endowment Fund disbursement, other fundraisers and available budget monies, we have \$37,378 for the project. This is slightly more than the quote we received. We will not have to borrow any money and will have some extra for contingencies. Thank you to the Stewardship Committee for conducting the Campaign and to our very generous members!

The Treasurer, Elena Wake, reported that we finished the 2018-2019 fiscal year in the black.

The Board discussed personnel. We took suggestions for a new Board Trustee to fill a resignation. We have a prospective person to be our church cleaner, who is currently filling out paperwork. Positions remaining unfilled are a member for the Committee on Ministry and Chairpersons for Religious Education and Marketing Committees.

The bronze dove from our old building was installed by David Mayfield. Thank you, David.

The Board Retreat on July 22 included: planning for the year-long process of writing vision and mission statements for the church, strengthening and supporting relationships in the church, following up on work suggested by the Strategic Plan.

UU Highlights
