Minister's Notes

17 February 2020

I am excited to have André Stoner speaking to our congregation. Some of us may know André from his work with the NNN (Near Northwest Neighborhood of South Bend); a few may know him as a former pastor at Kern Road Mennonite Church. He will speak to us as an organizer with the St. Joseph County chapter of Faith in Indiana.

André Stoner will present on March 1, after the service. While we enjoy our potluck lunch, we'll hear how Faith in Indiana is a multi-faith and multi-racial network of congregations, working with ordinary people to build relational power so that together we can speak effectively into policy and funding priorities on issues that impact our families and our neighbors. The St. Joe chapter has been working on issues of immigration, treatment not incarceration, gun violence reduction, and healthcare.

In its short few years of existence, our local chapter of Faith in Indiana has made significant progress. Come hear how we might be part of this worthy work.
