- 1. Chip's requests
 - a. Limiting evening meetings to no more than 3/week or 10/month
 - b. Meet 1x/week for 1pm gatherings, rather than 3x/week
 - c. Take month of leave in January
 - i. Give back 25% of salary and housing to pay for other ministers
 - ii. Gail wants to know if we can do that
 - iii. Lisa says this should be possible. It's up to us to decide. It's prudent for us to work out an arrangement that works for both to preserve the relationship. 75% would be a reasonable amount.
 - iv. 75% includes housing and salary, plus an 8.3% reduction in professional expenses (1/12) for the month of January
 - v. Disability leave can include sick and personal leave, which can be used first
- 2. Executive Session
- 3. Back to Full Session
 - a. Howard made a motion to approve 1 month leave with a 25% reduction in salary and housing, pension, and FICA. Professional development expenses are reduced by one month. Anne seconded the motion. Motion approved.
 - b. Sunday service plan will be finalized by Dec. 21st. There is a tentative plan for all services already.
 - c. Pastoral care will be handled by Care Committee. Amy and Kevin DeBeck are available for emergencies.
 - d. Tue, Thu, and Sat 1pm talks. Conversation for those in isolation. Becky could take 1 day/week on Tuesdays. Someone else can cover Thursdays in January. Saturdays will be eliminated.
 - e. Newcomer classes need to be kept going. Gail can handle those in January.
 - f. We will need to work out the link to Zoom so we have host privileges in January
- 4. How to Communicate All This
 - a. Lisa suggests joint communication with Chip and Melanie
 - b. Immediate press release announcing leave with details to follow
 - i. Email to members and friends
 - ii. Post leave plan on website
 - c. Melanie and Chip will meet at 9am on 12/10 to discuss communication plan
- 5. Approval of Minutes
 - a. Becky motioned to approve minutes. Gail seconded. Motion approved
- 6. Treasurer Report

- a. Deficit of \$14,000
- b. Pledges and auction donations are lagging
- c. Underspending and pledges offset each other
- d. Where is debt coming from?
 - i. Loose offering, holiday bazaar and auction losses
 - ii. Pledges are actually pretty on trend
 - iii. Expect an uptick in donations at end of year
- e. At end of year, will expect \$24,000 deficit. The plan is to offset with PPP and surplus from last year. Don't want to spend all the way down, but we're actually doing alright.
- f. Let's figure out our bottom line and then if we have a real short fall, we could do a fundraising campaign. We have many layers of "rainy day" funding to get through, and as Lisa says, this is a rainy day if there ever was one.
- g. We are watching the budget closely and will act accordingly if the trend lines concern us. Right now, we are okay.
- 7. Lasagna Dinner is cancelled for now
- 8. Christmas Service plans are in place
- 9. Board retreat is scheduled for Wednesday, 2/24/21
- 10. Motion to extend closure through 3/31/21
 - a. Howard motioned to approve extension with reevaluation for the rest of the spring in mid-March. Anne seconded. Motion passed.
