We're going to have to go with the CDC community metrics at this point. As case numbers become less and less reliable due to at-home testing and general apathy, hospital admissions are the best indicator of community spread. Unfortunately, they are also a lagging indicator by about 2 weeks, so case numbers will still play a role.

The CDC has two tiers now - less than 200 cases/100,000 and more than 200 cases/100,000. If you scroll down to look at the chart on their website, it explains these two levels very

I suggest we go with their green, yellow, and orange levels, and then create our own red category to know when to shut down again, if necessary. For the red category, I propose combining the over 200 cases/100,000 metric with the higher hospital admissions (+20/100,000) and in-patient beds occupied (+15%) metrics for the under 200 cases/100,000 tier of the chart. So, we would go back to all online if we have more than 200 cases/100,000 in the county, more than 20 new hospital admissions per day and more than 15% of hospital beds occupied by COVID patients.

## Green

- All restrictions lifted for most church events; on Sunday mornings, we request that everyone who enters the building wear a high-quality, well-fitting mask until 10 minutes after the worship service ends
- Vaccinations with up-to-date boosters are strongly encouraged for all eligible congregants
- Those who are at greater risk are welcome to mask and socially distance at all church events

## Yellow

- Being up-to-date on vaccinations and boosters for all eligible congregants is strongly recommended for in-person activities
- Masking and social distancing required
- No singing permitted
- Distanced socializing permitted indoors for 20 minutes before and after Sunday services or meetings
- No food or drinks indoors
- Outdoor capacity limit: None
- Indoor Sunday service capacity limit: 60
- Indoor small group limit: 20

## Orange

- Being up-to-date on vaccinations and boosters for all eligible congregants is strongly recommended for in-person activities
- N95/KN95/KF94 masks are strongly recommended and social distancing is required
- No singing permitted
- No food or drinks indoors.
- No socializing indoors
- Indoor Sunday service capacity limit: 30
- Indoor small group limit: 10 (take steps to improve ventilation)
- Outdoor capacity limit: 50
- PLEASE NOTE: The board may vote to move Sunday services and small groups online if case numbers and hospitalizations start to increase exponentially. Ideally 48 hours notice will be provided beforehand.

Red (200+ cases/100,000 AND 20+ hospital admissions/100,000 AND 15%+ in-patient beds are COVID)

- Sunday services held online only
- Outdoor capacity limit: 40
- No indoor meetings permitted

Only people performing essential tasks should be in building and on grounds—
 PLEASE NOTE: The board may vote to return to in-person Sunday services and small groups at the Orange level if case numbers and hospitalizations start to decrease exponentially and hospitals are no longer over-stressed.
