## **ACTIVITIES**

## PASTORAL CARE

We have had many people inquire about help from the Ministerial Discretionary Fund. When I am in for Office Hours, it is not uncommon for there to be three to five visitors each day.

## **MEDITATION**

I am tickled when folks bring me orders of service from the UU congregations they've visited while on vacation, so I thought I'd share a bit from the congregation in Colorado where I just took study leave.

The Unitarian Universalist Church of Boulder turned 75 on the second Sunday I preached, so they are similar in age to our congregation. They have about twice the number of members, and something like 2-3 times our operating budget, so our congregations aren't identical siblings. Still, there are many similarities, and one really compelling difference.

They, too, are teaching an OWL class this fall. They're also presenting multi-platform services, and they have a multiple-person team each Sunday to take care of all the sound and internet details. Each of the two Sundays I was there, there was some sort of snag which had to be fixed on the fly. Each time, the service went on and the changes were made smoothly. None of us are perfect, and many of us can face issues with grace and aplomb.

The really fascinating part of their service was their "Blessings and Concerns" ritual. People submitted written notes to be read by the worship leader, then folks had the opportunity to take a stone of blessing or a stone of concern, and place it in a wide tray of earth. I was moved by the story of the soil and stones: part of the mountains, cultivated by the indigenous peoples, cleansed by mountain snowfall, and gathered by loving members of the church. It really provided a sense of connection in both place and time.

We may not be among mighty mountains, but the story of humans in this fertile river plain is still compelling. We are still facing life's difficulties with compassion and courage.
